Maths / English	Write a report about a chosen artist (e.g. <i>Vincent Van Gogh</i> , <i>Claude Monet</i> , <i>Wassily Kandinsky</i>).	Choose a piece of famous artwork and write about why you like it.	Research about a particular technique a famous artist uses.
Big Questions (demonstrate your answers to these however you see fit)	Why is Picasso such a famous artist?	Lowry painted industrial scenes. Why did he use the style he did?	What makes an artist successful?
